This inclusive care model provides preventive care and long-term treatment, alleviates patient burden to local emergency departments and seeks to determine best practices to make positive change in the homeless community. As DSC volunteers, students gain valuable skills, develop as future physicians and most importantly, help provide essential services to our underserved patients experiencing homelessness.
